Please tell us briefly about your journey up to Orient Cement

I hail from Katni in MP. As a graduate in Mechanical Engineering in 1980 I started my career with Satna Cement Works in Brown Field Project and worked there from 1980 to 1985. From 1985 to 1986 I worked in Swadeshi Cement Kotputli (Rajastan). In 1986 I joined JP Cement at Rewa (MP) and worked up to 1997. During this period I have worked in plant operations and maintenance in various sections of Line 1 & Line 2. I left JP in 1997 and worked at Prism Cement, Satna (MP) up to 2004. Here I worked for Erection and Maintenance of CM&PP area, of green field project line -1. From 2002 to 2004 I worked as a HOD Stores and Purchase. From 2004 to 2013 September I was at Jaypee Rewa as HOD Mechanical (Line 1 and Line 2), and was Technical Head for Jaypee Bela, Erection and Commissioning, at Babupur Satna plant, and at Jaypee Gujarat Cement Plant as a Technical head. In Sep, 2013, I joined Orient Cement Limited, Chittapur Project, as Site Head.

How do you see Orient Cement from the other companies you were previously associated with?

At Orient Cement, the working culture, the job responsibility, accountability and working freedom is relatively much better.

What according to you would be the biggest challenge Orient Cement would face, as the 3 MTPA Plant becomes a reality?

According to me arranging fly ash and maximizing PPC products to sell in the nearby market will be the biggest challenge after the commissioning of the plant. Since in this location there are so many cement plants, it will be very challenging to establish and retain the market.

How effective do you think is the implementation of green practices across the cement sector in India?

Most cement plants in India have done a lot of work in pollution control and energy consumption and now Indian industries are second only to Japan. Indian cement industry however, has to improve in the mining sector for effective utilization of minerals.

What measures do you propose to undertake to further strengthen Orient Cement at Chittapur?

We have planned all necessary staff welfare measures like 'Good Township,' with basic facilities such as education, hospitals and transport, and to deploy and retain quality manpower during project or operation of our site at Chittapur.

What, according to you is a benchmark of "Quality?"

Team work, collective wisdom, delegation, easy accessibility to all, good mentorship etc.



43rd National Safety Week





Replacement of Fly Ash

With Fine Aggregates (SAND) In Concrete

The present production of fly ash in our country is around 250 million tonnes per annum and is increasing each day. However only about 25 % is being gainfully utilized. The utilization of fly ash in concrete production is very low. Concrete owes its unique position as a structural material due to the fact, that it is economical, highly resistant to fire, wind, water and earthquakes. The demand is likely to increase in the future to match the growing population, housing, transportation and other amenities. Concrete can be called as a composite material. For reducing the cost of concrete, greater use of pozzolonic materials like fly ash and blast furnace slag is suggested. The use of these materials as substitutes in concrete production would reduce the disposal problems now faced by thermal power plants and industrial plants and at the same time achieving the required higher strength of concrete.

The utility of fly ash as partial replacement in concrete mixes is on the rise these days. Fly ash is a waste product which is generated in thermal power stations. The quantity of fly ash produced and its percentage utilization is less than 25 %. Majority of fly ash produced is of Class F type. During the last few years, most cement companies have started using fly ash in manufacturing cement, which is known as PPC 'Pozzolana Portland cement.' But the overall percentage of utilization remains very low, and most of the fly ash is dumped at landfills which is dangerous to the environment as traces of toxic elements are present in Fly Ash. The best utilization is therefore in concrete which eliminates the effect of toxic elements.

Fly ash is generally used as replacement of cement, as an admixture in concrete, and in manufacturing of cement. Whereas concrete containing fly ash as a partial replacement of cement poses problems of delayed early strength development, concrete containing fly ash as partial replacement of fine aggregate will have no delayed early strength development, but rather will enhance its strength on a long-term basis.

In this context fly ash is used as sand replacement material.



The general material mix proportion can be as: M25 = 1:1.45:2.46:0.5, where each category comprises of various percentages of sand replacement material in increasing order i.e. 46%, 47%, 48%, 49%, 50%, 51%, 52%, 53%, 54%, and 55%. The workability is maintained constant for all mixes. Strength characteristics such as compressive strength and flexural strength of concrete mixes are found out for 3, 7, 28 day curing periods and results are analyzed to get the maximum desired strength. The proportions may be modified to get successful results with optimization of Fly Ash content. For the purpose of illustration, the actual test data using sand replacement with Fly ash for its 28 day compressive strength is given below

Strength values of M20 - 1: 1.45: 2.45:0.5 concrete mix with varying percentage replacement of sand (fine aggregate) with fly ash for 28 days curing period, with use of 20 mm machine crushed course aggregate:

It has been observed that as the percentage of fly ash increases, the compressive strength increases initially; on further increase in its percentage, its compressive strength is reduced. It can be seen that when sand is partially replaced by fly ash by 52% (52P) the compressive strength reaches its maximum for a 28 day curing period. The maximum compressive strength of fly ash concrete (52P) is increased by 45.32% when compared to plain cement concrete (PLAIN) for the 28 days curing period.

These trials have been done using OPC 53 Grade Cement, with fly ash content almost negligible. That is the reason why the demand of OPC has substantially grown in the market, since a few years. All organized large scale projects are now adopting this method.
